

SECOND TIMOTHY

Syllabus

I. GENERAL INFORMATION.

- A. This course consists of 16 video lessons.
- B. Each class is approximately 30 minutes long.
- C. Instructor: Russell Haffner.

II. DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE.

- A. This is an in-depth study of the epistle of 2nd Timothy with emphasis on practical application.
- B. Attention will be given to the book's background, authorship, date and content.
- C. Students will gain knowledge about God's instructions to preachers, the seriousness of teaching sound doctrine only, the obligation to refute false teaching and the triumphant end of a faithful Christian life.

III. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS.

- A. Required.
 - 1. Bible.
 - 2. 16 video lessons.
 - 3. Course Notes.
- B. Optional: Any conservative commentary on 2nd Timothy.

IV. REQUIREMENTS.

- A. Read the entire book of 2nd Timothy at least five times.
- B. View all 16 video lessons in their entirety.
- C. Read the Course Notes in their entirety.
- D. Take two exams.

- E. Submit a term paper (explained below).
- F. Have a grade average of 70 or more for each exam and a combined grade average of 70 or more for the course.

V. EXAMS.

- A. There are two exams on 2nd Timothy. The first exam is to be taken after finishing chapter 2, and the second exam is to be taken after finishing chapter 4.
- B. The study guides may be downloaded at any time. You may use the study guides while you are viewing the videos.
- C. When you take an exam you must do so completely from memory with no help from your Bible, study guides, Course Notes, etc.
- D. You do not need a proctor when taking the exams, God is your witness.

VI. TERM PAPER.

- A. Write a paper **in your own words** in which you give four (4) lessons to be learned from 2nd Timothy. Provide one lesson from **each** chapter. Develop each lesson into at least a full paragraph. Cite specific verse(s) in 2nd Timothy on which you base each of the four (4) lessons.
- B. The paper should be two to three pages long (12 point font, **double** spaced). **Do not exceed four pages**. The paper should be approximately 600 to 900 words.
- C. The paper should be submitted after you take your final exam.

VII. GRADING.

- A. The term paper and exams will be graded separately.
- B. Your final grade is based on an average of all assigned work.
- C. You may request a grade be explained or reconsidered, but in any case the *WVBS Online Bible School* will have the final say.

VIII. CREDIT.

Credit will be issued, including a certificate, only after all work has been successfully completed.
